

9005 Pairs of Spectacles in one year



In May's edition of Midland News we highlighted the efforts of Shirley Lions Club with regard to Campaign Sight First II. When we set about achieving our self set target of raising £6,500 for CSFII, the Club was determined that it should not be the detriment of it's regular activities. Since 1998 Lion Eric Morris has been Shirley Club's "Used Spectacles Officer" and has regularly collected about 5,000 pairs of used spectacles every year. Having set the target of £6,500 for CSFII, Lion Eric agreed to match this with a personal target of 6,500 pairs of used spectacles.

As previously reported the £6,500 was achieved and we went on to raise £8,000. To match this Lion Eric not only hit his target of 6,500 spectacles but he went on to collect 9,005 used pairs of spectacles in the one Lionistic year.

We calculate that in the 10 years Lion Eric has being doing this he has collected over 55,000 pairs of spectacles.

We are sure that a great many other Clubs in the District are doing the same but if anyone can beat Lion Eric we should like to hear from you.

P.S. Not content with the spectacles, Lion Eric has now started collecting used hearing aids, again for which there is a huge demand in the third world.

This is in addition to the 37,000 being distributed by Lions in Solihull.

Message in a Bottle

Lion Martin Wright from Shirley Lions Club was approached for a supply of the Lions Message in a Bottle for an event being organised by the local NHS Care Trust. A box was purchased by the Club to enable a bottle to be given to all of the pensioners attending the event. In addition, a further small supply was given to some organisations who also attended. Some of the spare bottles were eventually seen by a colleague in the Care Trust who thought it would be a good idea to distribute them to everyone over the age of 65 in the area – all 37,000 of them. After a great deal of discussion and persuasion the Care Trust eventually decided to fund the purchase of all 37,000 bottles which are currently being distributed by the combined Lions Clubs in Solihull and so far around 12,000 bottles have been distributed.

With the enthusiasm this generated thoughts turned to neighbouring PCT areas and a visit was organised to give a presentation to the Emergency Health committee in neighbouring Birmingham East & North. Before the meeting, it was thought that a lot of persuasion would be needed to extract funds from the NHS for a second time. The Chairperson was undecided but consulted the other members of the committee for their views. This was incredibly positive with glowing testimonies from various quarters who had seen MiaB in operation combined with the anticipation of the benefits MiaB would give in the event of a flu pandemic. This made the take up of the Lions scheme the only real option and an order for a further 65,500 bottles was eventually submitted although the Lions were not needed to help in their distribution.
