## Corby Lions Help Emergency Services Cadets

We were impressed by the community spirit being shown by these young people and wanted to help provide them with kit to do their training. They intend to put the money towards purchasing fleece tops to wear during NESC rescues and practical exercises. We previously assisted them with purchasing a gazebo for them to use at community events. Back in July several of us attended a 'passing out' parade and demonstration of skills at Corby Fire station and were very impressed with their knowledge and abilities.' Northamptonshire Emergency Services Cadets teaches teenagers aged 13 - 18 about the work of the police, fire and ambulance services. This unit is based at Kingswood Secondary Academy in Corby.

Corby and District Lions Club would like to thank all the people who purchased light toys from us at the recent Corby Bonfire and firework event - it has raised over £1000 for charity.

**Dug Wells for Sitikho Ward, Bungoma County, Kenya (£7,700, about £1550 each Well & includes £1000 from Dudley Lions)** I am writing to advise you of the current situation of the above Project which commenced in 2016, following the successful completion of the Greenhouse & Pipeline Project.

£8,005.00 has been raised and £4,680.00 has been sent to PCC, Lion Pape Sembi, Lions Club of Kakamega, Kenya where 3 dug wells have been completed. He has partnered with 'Jesus to all Nations Missions', to identify secure locations that will benefit the whole community with Bishop Humphrey involving Government Departments.

I have not been able to contact Pape Sembi, and on our behalf PDG Femi Onabolu 105M, visited Kenya and confirmed that there are some issues with location of the wells and that permanent

plaques have not been erected alongside each well with donor's name.

Femi advises that Pape has had numerous problems that have taken him away from Kenya and has promised to deal with the issues and I am of course continuing to pursue this and believe that a successful conclusion can be reached.

However I have recommended to Cabinet that the money held £3,325.00 be transferred to the new 'Global Brigades' Ghana Project led and managed by Lion Doctor Liam Barrett of Marston Green Lions Club and President of 'Global Brigades UK'. **This has been agreed.**

As you may know The University of Birmingham is a chapter of 'Global Medical Brigades' an International movement of students and medical professionals working alongside communities and staff to implement sustainable health systems. They work in remote rural areas in Honduras, Panama, Nicaragua and Ghana, who would otherwise have limited access to health care.

Lion Doctor Barrett will lead the Ghana Project and the aim is to raise £10,010.00 in this Lions year before the new District commences. District Officer's Recommendations suggest a contribution of £150.00 per Club towards this Project, but a lower or higher amount would be greatly appreciated.
